A college professor announced a surprise test. He passed out papers upside down with instructions not to turn them over until so directed. They were told to write what they saw on the other side.

When they turned them over there was only a black spot in the center of the page. Again, he instructed, "Write about what you see." He called them and read what they had written. In every case they had written about the black spot. No one said anything about the 93 square inches of white paper. It wasn't really a test. It was a lesson.

Is there a lesson here for us? When you look at yourself, what do you notice? Do you see the bad or the good? How about your church? Do you focus on the good stuff or the not so good? How about other churches, unchurched, or unbelievers? What do you see in the leaders in our community, state, and nation? I regularly get emails about how bad they are that never-never have anything good to say. There is a place and time for correction, but that needs to be in the context of the other 93 square inches.

#### ABOUT BAPTISMAL MINISTRY

The change to Ministry Teams both expands the leadership core of members and improve the oversight structure of the church. While these changes in and of themselves increase "baptismal ministry." there is much more work beyond just restructuring. This is the ongoing work of the church in the next few decades. Together we need to learn how to be the church in a non-Christian world, how to live faithful Christian lives, and how to do the work God has called us to do with the time, gifts and resources God has given us. Inviting every member of the church to discover and exercise his or her ministry is what baptismal ministry is about. It is not just about making the organizational structure clearer and decision-making easier, nor is it about saving money or finding a way to have a priest (pastor) in a remote area. It is mostly and most importantly about being the people of faith whom the Spirit has called us to be as God's people gathered at this particular church. And it is only when we live into that reality that we will begin to know that God, acting in and though us, has the power to do much more than we can ask or imagine.

#### **Un-Apologetic Column 28**

#### Same Sex Marriage Part 1

Earlier this year when the Supreme Court found a provision for same sex marriage in the Constitution, I think many Christians felt defeated. It wasn't just the loss on this one issue in court, but it signified a fundamental shift in the culture away from Christian values, and towards a more secular society. While this issue is too complex to deal with in a few short newsletters, I will touch on a few points in the upcoming letters to address this issue. And to start out with, I will discuss two key points of clarification we need in order to better address this issue.

You may have noticed that I used the term "Same sex marriage" rather than "Gay marriage". There is a reason for that. As we discuss these issues, I think terminology is critical. The reason I use the term same sex marriage follows.

First, there never was a restriction on gay marriage. That may sound strange, but hear me out. All of us who are married had to fill out a marriage license with the state we were to be married in. Was anyone asked on that form what your sexual orientation was? No, they weren't. The requirements were that you had to be a man and a woman. This may sound like splitting hairs, but in law terminology is critical. The accusation was that gays were being discriminated against, and that simply wasn't true. They had the same access, and same restrictions to marriage that straight couples had. In other words, two straight men couldn't be married either. The restriction wasn't based on sexual orientation, but on gender. Gay marriage WOULD be discriminatory, because it would exclude straight same sex couples that wanted to marry. So the law had to be changed to allow same sex unions, not just gay unions.

The second point I would like to bring out is, why the government is interested in marriage at all. I have heard several people say that government shouldn't be involved in licensing these unions, but the fact is, the government has a vested interest in promoting certain unions over others.

I have a good friend that I have been in a relationship with for many years now. He is one of my best friends. We love each other as brothers, and I can't imagine what life would be like without him to talk to and share my life with. The government has no interest in our relationship. And I think many of us would find it intrusive if the government wanted to license such relationships. If homosexual couples were being discriminated against by being excluded from marriage, so were every other pair of unmarried citizens who have deep, loving commitments to each other. Why should gays get preferential treatment just because they are sexually involved with each other?

The reason governments throughout history have promoted marriage between and man and a woman is because these unions as a rule and by nature produce the next generation of citizens. They are a stabilizing force in society, especially for young men, and provide the optimum unions for raising children. And children are the key factor here. Look at any study on early childhood development, and you will find that children do best in a nonviolent, intact home with both biological parents present. This isn't to say that children can't thrive in other types of households. But we are looking for the best option as a rule, and a traditional marriage gives children the best chance to thrive.

Next month I would like to give some of the common arguments in favor of same sex marriage, and some responses to those arguments. I am always interested in your feedback or thoughts on anything we discuss here, so please drop me a line with what you are thinking! I look forward to talking with you next month.

#### Self CPR - HOW TO SURVIVE A HEART ATTACK WHEN ALONE

Since many people are alone when they suffer a heart attack, without help, the person whose heart is beating improperly and who begins to feel faint, has only about ten seconds left before losing consciousness.

However, these victims can help themselves by coughing repeatedly and very vigorously. A deep breath should be taken before each cough, and the cough must be deep and prolonged, as when producing sputum from deep inside the chest.

A breath and a cough must be repeated about every two seconds without let-up until help arrives, or until the heart is felt to be beating normally again.

Deep breaths get oxygen into the lungs and coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating. The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it regain normal rhythm. In this way, heart attack victims can get to a hospital.

Tell as many other people as possible about this. It could save their lives!
