WARNING!

Last year, I warned church members to beware of home improvements utilizing the H.E.R.O. program or other types of P.A.C.E. financing where the expense is assessed to your tax bill. I even contacted the Press Enterprise and Board of Realtors. But at that time, in 2014, I found no one interested in investigation this practice.


However, just recently the newspaper has exposed some of these pitfalls. They interviewed me, after I spoke to Paul Herrera of our Inland Valley Association of Realtors, at a

local meeting, now that law suits are growing. It sounds very enticing to upgrade your home with energy efficient improvements with no out of pocket expense. But, I have found that the services the contractors offer, may be far more costly than they should be.

In the case I worked with, the contractor's bill was nearly three times the bid from a competing A/C company. To add to that, there are finance fees that the H.E.R.O program and the County tag on to the bill resulting in a very high tax assessment you will pay every year until the term is completed. Oh, and yes, there are prepayment penalties as well. FHA and FANNIE MAE will not allow buyers to assume your tax bill. You will pay it in full when you sell your home. (Solar Leases are handled differently.)

SO, please shop around. Know what your home improvements would cost if purchased from a window or A/C company. Investigate other ways to finance the improvements, either through the contractor directly, or with a small home equity line of credit. KNOW your options.. before you sign.


Dear Members of SVLC,

Sodium and sugar. How do they effect blood pressure? In a three year study using 3000 subjects, it was found that sugar, in the form of sodas, desserts, donuts, etc. caused a greater elevation in blood pressure than sodium. Subjects had their b/p taken minutes before consuming a high sodium food such as potato chips, luncheon meat sandwich, etc. Ten minutes after eating their b/p was repeated with no increase in pressure. Where as, those having eaten high sugar drinks or foods had their blood pressure increase by 25% to 30%. NOT GOOD!

By decreasing the amount of sugar we usually consume in a day could be the catalyst to starting a reduction in our weight.


