### Gifts for a King!

Every year, we hear the Christmas story. The kids put on their program, and we see the gifts of the wise men presented to the baby Jesus: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. But what are these things? Is there any significance to them?

We all know about gold; it's a precious metal worth large amounts of money. We make jewelry from it, and even the value of our currency is based on the value of gold. So, think of what this mineral was worth more than 2,000 years ago. Few people had anything with any gold on it. The temple was adorned with it, and idols were made from it. Gold was a thing to be prized; it was something for kings. And here, these wise men are giving it to a child.

Frankincense is a fragrant resin harvested from certain trees, and it was often burned as incense for religious purposes. In fact, frankincense was one of the ingredients for the incense burned by Moses at the tent of meeting where he would go to meet with the Lord. Again, this was a valuable item in the days of Jesus.

Likewise, myrrh is also a resin harvested from certain trees. However, myrrh was often used as a perfume, rather than incense, though it was used for that purpose, as well. he most common use was to cover the odor of corpses before burial. Myrrh was also a very expensive item, sometimes worth an equal weight of gold or more.

So, here we have three very valuable items, items often reserved as gifts for royalty, being given to Jesus by these wise men from the east. Is there any significance behind these gifts? here very well could be, as I will share with you at our Advent services this month. Looking forward to seeing you there!

I pray that this season of Advent is a joyful one for all of you. Christ our Savior is born!

As I read over it for him, I found it not only made sense but it was a profound and different view of Christmas. So much so, that I asked him if I could share his thoughts with you as well. I love Christmas. I love everything at about it. The church services, the music, the TV specials, the decorations. I love hot cocoa, carols, Christmas trees, Christmas specials, candle light worships, family, togetherness, everything-- you name it, I love it. I remember as a kid looking forward to Christmas Eve and I did what every kid my age did, I waited up for Santa Claus. Even though I was told I had to go to bed before he got there or there wouldn't be any presents the next morning, I loved to try and wait for him anyway. But as I grew up I also knew that Christmas was about far more than Santa and his elves. It was about Jesus. And so, I began to enjoy another kind of waiting. A more contemplative waiting for the day we celebrate the birth of our Savior. Like many Christians, I was offended that so many people enjoy the holidays without any reference to Jesus or Christianity. There are some terrible misconceptions surrounding the true meaning of the season. To many it is all about money, commercialism, and greed. Others see it as a time for parties, meals, and get-togethers.

Many children know Christmas only as a time for Santa, Frosty the snowman, and Rudolph the Red-nosed Reindeer. As a result, many people have no idea what the true meaning of Christmas is all about and I wanted to remind people that without Christ, there would be no Christmas in the first place. "Jesus is the Reason for the Season," You've seen it on posters and billboards, cards and ads in the newspaper. You have no doubt heard that reminder during Christmas when everyone is focusing on presents and caroling and eggnog. People remind you Jesus is the reason for the season because they want you to know that Jesus is the reason for all the celebrating and joy; He is the reason for peace on earth, He is the reason for the festive Christmas season. As I have grown in my faith, however, I have come to a different conclusion. Many say, and I know what they are saying when they do, that "Jesus is the reason for the season. But in the Bible, God presents a different view of Christmas. The Bible sets the record straight where Christmas is concerned! God gives us, in no uncertain terms, the true reason for the season. And, while Jesus is the reason we celebrate the season, in a very real sense, WE are the reason for the season!

Before you brand me a heretic and lead me to the stake to be burned, let me explain. Christmas is a Christian holiday and Jesus is the reason for celebrating the season, but you have to remember that Jesus was not born for Himself or His own personal gain...He was born for you. All that He did on earth, His birth, His life death, and resurrection were for you, not for Himself or the angels or some animals somewhere, it was all for you. In the eyes of Jesus, He isn't the reason for the season. You are. Don't misunderstand; I'm not proclaiming you the center of the universe. I'm saying that it is our sin that made Christmas necessary. I'm saying if you were the only person on the face of this planet that needed saving, Jesus still would've come down to earth that first Christmas morning to redeem your soul. Martin Luther would often say that the manger and the cross are made of the same wood. That is to say that they are both made by wood stained with the blood of the sin and disobedience of God's creatures. They are also stained with the sweat and tears of a God who cares about His creation. His care is shown in His sending His Son, Jesus, to close the gap of distance and separation between Him and creatures. God gave us the greatest gift that any of us could ever have and that was His Son. God gave us the gift of forgiveness. Jesus was born and lived so that He could offer Himself as a sacrifice for our sin, the ultimate act of love. What a wonderful gift that we have been given. So celebrate this wonderful gift this season, it is the source of our joy, but as you celebrate, remember, you are the reason this gift was given and thank God that He loved you enough to give this gift to you.

wonderful so many helped to bring in items to help our local group. Thank you all so much for all your thoughtfulness.





### Heart Attacks Spike After the Flu

Just another reason to be sure to get your flu shot. In a study of 578 heart attack patients, 17% reported having the flu, a cold, or other respiratory infection within a week prior to the attack. Symptoms to watch for are chest pain, shortness of breath, nausea and lightheadedness.

When having your blood pressure taken:

Sit in a chair with your back against the back. Support your arm so that it is at heart level. Breath slowly.

3rd and drawing names for a Secret Santa gift exchange and on December 17th we'll have the gift exchange and Christmas goodies. Hope you can all make it.




