“BACK TO THE BASICS . . . THE PREAMBLE & OBJECT / MISSION”



I have been taking an online course to prepare for the National Association of Parliamentarians Certification/Membership exam. This is the first step toward becoming a professional parliamentarian, if I choose to go that far with it. In doing so I have been reviewing the Constitution and By-Laws of Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church in a new light. The “Preamble” is an introductory statement setting forth the general principles of an organization and why it exists. The “Object,” (or Mission) is a general and concisely expressed statement (usually a single sentence) expressing the purpose and range of activities of an organization. The Preamble in Shepherd of the Valley’s Constitution outlines a number of general parameters and pursuits of the church:

1. Preach the Gospel to the whole world.
2. Submit to and follow God’s will:
 - a. Unite in worship;
 - b. Grow in God’s Word;
 - c. Fellowship with one another;
 - d. Witness to all men;
 - e. Help others and serve the needs of others;
 - f. Administer the Office of the Keys;
 - g. Maintain decency and order in the Church.



And the Object, or Mission, is stated as follows: **“To glorify God by practicing Christ’s love in our community.”** By the way, this mission is stated at the top of our weekly news bulletin.

These are fine statements that outline the general reasons and purposes that Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church exists. Are they “our” statements though? They are the crafted statements of our founding leadership some 34 years ago. Furthermore they still outline a scripturally accurate mission and activity of Christ’s church. However, again I ask, do we own these articles as our own... as if we wrote them? Do they drive the budget, programs and activities of our church?

It is my opinion that as a church these are still very valid statements that we continue to hold to as a congregation. I’m not sure just how forcefully they drive the mission and ministry of Shepherd. We want them to, but somehow the statements in the constitution, or at the top of our bulletins, have not leapt off the page and into our hearts. I suspect that the charter members and leaders of Shepherd truly espoused these general statements when they went out into the Moreno Valley community inviting children to Sunday School and families to the Church. It’s time we get back to the basics, not just agreeing with them, or writing them into some sort of strategic plan for the future. We need to own them, pursue them and live them! We must reach out to others with the Good News of the Gospel and be the winsome witnesses we are called to be! We must unite weekly in prayer and worship with one another (not occasionally)! As the body of Christ it is imperative that we pursue unity and harmony in fellowship with one another. We must be compelled to love one another as Christ loved us and celebrate the forgiveness of sins with each other. We must glorify God by practicing Christ’s love in our community – the faith community and the Moreno Valley community!

WHERE DO WE START? A good place to start is always in prayer! I invite all of Shepherd of the Valley to join me in praying for the mission and ministry of our church on Thursday evenings at 6:00 p.m. in the church sanctuary. We will start on June 5th. Each evening we’ll re-read the Preamble and the Object of our church, and pray for God’s Spirit to work in our hearts the will and desire to follow Christ’s example and be His faithful disciples. We’ll meet and pray for about 15-30 minutes with one, ten or a hundred people - whoever comes! If you cannot come because of work or other obligations, please take a moment to pray in your heart for our work as the church of God. If you can’t come every week, that’s expected and understandable. If you can come, please join us for this intentional and dedicated time of prayer. If you can come, but just choose not to, we’ll pray for you! **THURSDAYS at 6:00 p.m. in the Church..... “Let Us Pray!”**

Un-apologetic column 15

Peter Boghossian, the Church Whisperer

Many of my columns have to do with objections raised by the New Atheists. This group is headlined by the "Four Horseman", consisting of Richard Dawkins, Daniel Dennett, Sam Harris and (prior to his death in 2011) Christopher Hitchens. What's new about the new atheists is not their arguments against Christianity. The ideas they put forth have been in play for hundreds of years, and have been answered by Christian thinkers long ago. What this group banks on is that Christians are largely ignorant of these answers, or will not take the time to research the objection. While some of these men are brilliant scientists and writers, they make fundamental mistakes when thinking about religion. Sadly, many Christians fall prey to the poor thinking and reasoning that's found in their books.

What's different about the New Atheists is their attitude. They are loud, brash and in your face. They are not afraid to name call, and openly mock and deride Christians and their beliefs. This approach is very popular with younger generations raised on shock jocks and unaccustomed to having to argue persuasively for a position. Mind you, this group prides themselves as being the ones who have science and reason on their side. Some of you may see the irony here of claiming to be on the reasonable end of an argument that they try to win by name calling. While their arguments may not be as strong as a person they are engaged in conversation with, their one liners or zingers can often make them look like they are winning a debate they are not.

The newest member of the New Atheists is a gentleman named Dr. Peter Boghossian. Peter Boghossian is a full time faculty member in the philosophy department at Portland State University and an affiliated faculty member at Oregon Health Science University in the Division of General Internal Medicine. He's a national speaker for the Center of Inquiry and the Secular Student Alliance, and an international speaker for the Richard Dawkins Foundation for Reason and Science. He has written a book titled "A Manual for Creating Atheists," and will soon have a T.V. show titled "The Church Whisperer." In his T.V. show, he will tape himself going into churches to talk people out of their faith in Christ.

Dr. Boghossian's tactics are shrewd, and he is very good at making you look foolish if you are not prepared to encounter him. He creates some interesting new definitions for words that make it hard for a person of faith to make their case. This is where he differs from the other New Atheists. While the others simply make fun of Christians, He offers a plan to de-convert the believer. With the popularity of his book on the rise, I'm sure his method will begin being copied by others.

Next month, I will acquaint you with some of his arguments and definitions that give Christians trouble, and show you how you can avoid some traps he and others will lay for you. While you are waiting, get your hearing checked. That whisper you hear in the back of the church could mean trouble!

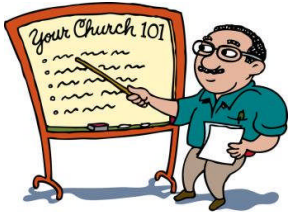

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP



What is the "Holy Christian Church"? And, who is a member of the "Church?" – The simple straight forward answer to this is, all who believe in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior! Notice, it is not restricted to only those who are baptized. However those who are believers in Jesus Christ desire to be baptized, when/if there is the opportunity. Notice also, it is not restricted to only those who are members of some specific (visible and earthly) church. Yet, true believers in Jesus Christ will want to be members of some visible church in order to gather with other believers around the means of grace, that is God's Word and Sacraments. Most of the time, I suspect, when we talk about or try to define "church membership" are not thinking about it in these terms. We are probably focusing on membership in a church organization, such as Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church. Who is a member of Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church? In order to answer that we need to consult the By-Laws of Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church. Certainly the Bible, our Lutheran Confessions and the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (denomination) also have something to say about membership in Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church, but these are generally incorporated into the Constitution and By-Laws. But, before going further, let it be clearly stated and understood that membership in God's church is a matter of faith alone! He knows those who are His and truly confess Him as their Savior and Lord.

All that being said, let's discuss membership from a congregational viewpoint. Membership in the local congregational organization varies from church to church. For some churches one is a member of the church by simply attending. In other churches, like Shepherd of the Valley, there are various ways of becoming a member. There are also a number of categories of church membership. One may join Shepherd of the Valley by being baptized or confirmed, or by transferring in from another Lutheran congregation. One may also join by a Profession of Faith. These are listed and defined in the By-Laws, Article I, part A. The Categories of Membership listed in Article I, part B include:

1. Baptized Membership - Children and Adults who have received the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in the name of the Triune God.
2. Communing Membership - Those who have been admitted to the Lord's Table.
3. Confirmed Membership - Those who have made a public profession of faith (*Youth or Adult Confirmation*).
4. Voting Membership - Those who participate in the governing process of the Congregation, who are Confirmed members at least 18 years old.

In an effort to operate more faithfully under the By-Laws of the congregation, I am contacting 'members' who are not, officially speaking, in one of the above categories of membership, but may have been attending and participating for months, even years, as a very faithful part of Shepherd of the Valley. We also have some "Communing Members" who are not "Voting Members," (but could / should be) that I want to meet with. Conversely we have some members who are officially "Baptized-Communing-Confirmed-Voting Members," yet rarely worship and commune with us or participate in any way, that the Board of Lay Ministry and I want to reach out to. It is my goal to address a majority of these concerns before our Annual Meeting in August.

I suppose one might think that all of this is rather "nit-picky" and unnecessary. Quite frankly, I'm one of them sometimes! But it is very important that we conduct the matters of the church decently and in good order. Where matters of faith are concerned it is also a part of my calling as your Pastor. So, please don't be upset if I contact you about membership issues, or read any more into it. Should you have any concerns or questions about your membership status, please contact me. Thank you!

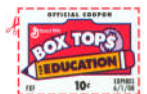
Joseph Project - Community (Citywide) food Bank
