"TURNING SHEPHERD OF THE VALLEY - 'INSIDE - OUT!' "



Two remarkable things have truly impressed me the last couple of months through Ruth Ann's hospitalization and her treatment of her cancer. The first I did not witness, but Ruth Ann shared with me. When she was in a lot of pain and discomfort, one of her doctors at the hospital spent time with her and he even prayed with her! I have never experienced that personally and was so impressed with that doctor's care and ministering to my wife! The other was when we went to the cancer clinic in Riverside and met the nurse who would be working with Ruth Ann. She entered the examination room and looked at her file, then looked up and asked, "Are you Ruth Ann Krueger?" Naturally, we said, "yes." She then responded, "I have been praying for you for the past month or so. Your name is on the prayer list of our church." (Riverside Presbyterian). Wow! Both of these medical professionals were living their faith and not just treating a patient, they were ministering to a person! They were letting their light shine!

Most of us have heard the phrase, "Thinking outside of the box." It means that often times, in order to succeed, one needs to go beyond thinking and doing things the way we always have, or in the traditional kinds of ways. For churches today this is absolutely vital. But it is a very hard thing to do. We all get quite comfortable with our routines and traditions. This seems especially true in the church. But, if we are going to truly be effective twenty-first disciples we're called to be, not only are we going to have to be turned inside out and we're going to have to minister way outside the sanctuary (box). We are going to have to push out the walls of the church into the Moreno Valley community! This won't be easy. It means we might have to give up some of our own preferences and likes in order to serve those around us. Of course, I'm not talking about doctrine or theology. I am talking about other things that have become just as near and dear to us (unfortunately) like our buildings and properties, worship formats, etc. This is challenging! Look at what happened to Jesus when He taught that the church needed to minister outside of the temple, or the Sabbath laws, or the many of other laws, customs and traditions of established Judaism.

At our last all staff and volunteer collaborative meeting the one thing we said HAS TO HAPPEN at Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church as soon as possible, is a training and equipping workshop on how to share one's faith and the hope of Jesus in the Gospel. This is what the Lord has called us for, gifted us to accomplish and empowered us to do by the power of the Holy Spirit! Plan now to come to this workshop on September 20th.



Take-Along Shopping List for Lutheran World Relief Kits

**Cut out this list and keep it in your purse or wallet for easy reference
when you run into seasonal sales.**

*** SCHOOL KITS:**

- (4) 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper; no loose-leaf paper
- (1) 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- (1) pencil sharpener
- (1) blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- (5) unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- (5) black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- (1) box of 16 or 24 crayons
- (1) 2½" eraser

PERSONAL CARE KITS:

- (1) light-weight bath-size towel (between 20"x40" & 52"x27"), dark color recommended
- (2) bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping
- (1) adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- (1) sturdy comb, remove packaging
- (1) metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

CH IV I Will Pray for My Pastor and Church Leaders


- I will pray for our pastors and other church leaders in their service in God’s church.

- I will pray together as a family for the church.
- I will worship together as a family.
- I will teach and lead my family to be committed to the church, the Bride of Christ.

CH VI I Will Treasure Church Membership as a Gift

- Church membership is not a burdensome responsibility. It is a privilege and a gift!
- Biblical church membership means being a part of the Body of Christ!
- I am a member of the universal and invisible Holy Christian Church!
- Church membership is a gift of the Holy Spirit that calls me to faith and gathers me into the fellowship of believers.

Co-exist or Contradict?



I often wonder what people must think of me when they look at the back of our car. We are a one car family, so a great deal of compromise goes into what is displayed on our vehicle. I was allowed to have my Denver Bronco's license plate covers in exchange for the Tinker Bell sticker on our back window. Strategically placed below Tinker Bell is my Stand to Reason sticker stating "Christianity Worth Thinking About." This is next to the stick figure representation of our family (minus one cat, we ran out of stickers for them). Rounding out this odd ball compromise is the Mickey Mouse antenna ball with Pirates of the Caribbean hat. In a world used to everyone having their own car, I can just imagine the mental picture people must derive of the driver of this odd vehicle!

There are some purists out there who would not dream of putting anything foreign on their car, but most of us have something on our vehicles to show the world what we are passionate about. This can be something as simple as a Jesus fish on the back, all the way up to having so many stickers you can't tell what color the car is.

I'm sure most of you have seen the "Coexist" sticker that is popular now days. If you're not familiar with it, it spells out the word coexist using different religious symbols for the letters. At first glance, this sticker seems to be calling for peace among the world's religions. This is a worthy goal that I applaud. But a bit deeper thought betrays a mindset that exists today about religion. The message is subtle, but it is there. That message is "stop acting like your religion is the right one." In other words, all religions are equally true and valid. Picking one is like choosing what flavor ice cream you like. Why would you get mad or argue about who likes what flavor ice cream? In the same sense, why are you trying to promote your religion over others? Why can't you just let people do what works for them and stop making trouble?

To point out the faulty thinking promoted on this sticker, one clever individual has begun producing his own sticker. It states "Contradict (using the same religious symbols as the other sticker), they can't all be true." This exposes the faulty claim of the first sticker, namely that religions make different claims about God, reality and truth that contradict one another. Take Christianity and Judaism as an example. Christians claim that Jesus was the Messiah, the Jews claim he was not the Messiah. One of us is right. There is no way Jesus can be the Messiah and not the Messiah at the same time. Buddhists claim that the world as we know it is an illusion, Islam claims it isn't. Christians say the Trinity exists, Jehovah's Witnesses claim it does not.

While religions have similarities, it is the differences that are important.

This is what makes evangelism in our current culture so difficult. People won't argue with you that Jesus is the only way to heaven, they will agree. They will say Jesus is the only way...for you. But for others they will argue, any way is ok as long as it works for the person. And anyway, isn't it arrogant to believe that only you have the truth and everyone else is wrong?

Let me clue you in on something here. Everyone thinks their view is the correct one, even the person chastising you for thinking your way is right. We all think our view is correct, or we wouldn't hold it. The view that no one has the truth about religion is still a truth claim. The person making the statement thinks that this is the way everyone ought to think about religion. If they try and wiggle out of this by saying they aren't sure their view is true, then they are on even shakier ground. Why should I believe a view that even the person holding it isn't sure of?

In keeping with our new focus on evangelism, I will start a new series next month on using apologetics in evangelism. Until then, I encourage you to use bumper stickers as conversation starters. Ask questions about what you see, and try to plant a seed or two with someone.


Joseph Project - Community (Citywide) food Bank



FROM PASTOR and RUTH ANN



Congregational Meeting

THE ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL ASSEMBLY

**SUNDAY, AUGUST 17th,
following the 10:45 a.m. Praise Service.**



Our constitution stipulates that the congregation must have an annual meeting each year. The primary business of this annual voters' assembly is the election of various board positions and the discussion and ratification of the church (church & school) budget for the next fiscal year. The Nomination Committee will post a slate of candidates in the church two weeks before the meeting. All voting members are eligible to submit names to the Nominating Committee no later than three weeks before the meeting (by August 3rd), however nomination cannot come from the floor at the annual meeting. A slate of nominees and a copy of the budget will also be mailed out to the membership prior to the 8/17 meeting. **Submit nominees to Congregational President Phil Sandstrom.**

The By - Laws state that congregational meetings must follow the latest edition (11th) of *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised*. It wouldn't be a bad idea to consult this meeting guideline so that you are familiar with how the meeting is to be run. They can be found for free on the internet. Note especially, if a voting member makes a motion to call the previous question (or a motion to end debate) and it is seconded and passed by the assembly with a 2/3 majority vote - then all discussion on that main motion immediately ends and a vote is taken. In the past this has frustrated some members who still wanted to speak to the motion, but were unable to because a 2/3 majority voted that they were ready to vote. *Robert's Rules* can seem rather complicated, but they do provide a very fair guideline for running a meeting.

Pray for God's wisdom and blessing on our upcoming Annual Meeting.
