Something interesting happens on our calendars this year. Two celebrations that seem to have little, if anything, in common fall on the same day, Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day. The last time these two days fell on the same day was in 1945, over 70 years ago. Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the Lenten season, a season of somber remembrance and repentance while Valentine's Day is a day of romance and love.

While it may seem that there is nothing in common about these days, I would argue that there is more in common than you would think. At the heart of both days is a single idea, love.

We all know about Valentine's Day. It is a day of love and romance and we celebrate our love in tangible ways. We show our love to those important people in our lives, our spouses or significant others especially, by giving gifts or cards. I would suggest that Ash Wednesday is very much the same. While we may see Ash Wednesday as only a day of sorrow and contrition, a day where we remember our sins and our mortality, there is more to it. As we remember these things we repent of them, that is, we turn away from them. As we turn from them we turn to God. The ashes so often received as a sign of our sinfulness and mortality are placed on us in the shape of a cross. That cross is our Valentine from God. There, on a cross, God showed His great love for us as He died in our place, for our sins, so that we could be forgiven and have eternal life in paradise. So as we repent of our sins, turning away from them and from the things of this fallen world, we turn to the open arms of a loving God.

These two days that seem to have so little in common share the very same idea, love. As we begin this Lenten season we look to the God who loves us, who gave everything for us even though we don't deserve it. And in truth, that is what Valentine's Day is about, showing love for others, not just our spouses or significant others, but for all people in our lives. We don't love them because they deserve our love, we love them simply because, well, because they are them and are important to us. We show them our love with cards and flowers and gifts, through our words and actions. That is exactly what God did for us; He loved us because we are His creation and are important to Him, He showed that love to us as He took our sins upon himself, He tells us about that love in His Word.

Ash Wednesday is perhaps the best Valentine we will ever receive. It is God telling us that He loves us even though we are sinners. It is God telling us that He has taken care of our sins. It is God opening His arms to call us His beloved children and welcome us home. And while many single people don't celebrate Valentine's Day because it is seen as a day for couples, this Valentine from God is for everyone: young and old, singles and couples, men and women; there is no one that is left out from this Valentine, there is no one God has not given this gift to.

Over the years we have lost a few members and added others until at the present time there are approximately 20 who join in the effort.

He will fill us with His praise in the midst of our sorrow. Week after week, we will enter the places of the Passion only to discover our Lord . . . waiting for us . . . willing to share with us a love that was set in place before the foundations of the world.

Plan to come to our Lenten services this year. Prepare to enter into these places of devotion, for there, your Lord will meet you, sharing with you His wondrous love that saves a fallen world.

COUGHING: A Secret Danger

If you are coughing and it has lasted over two weeks, see your doctor. If you are short of breath, have a high fever, chest pain or are coughing up blood, be seen as soon as pos-

sible. Right now you can still get the flu shot. If you are at least 65 you can get the high dose vaccine. Also available is the Prev 13 pneumonia vaccine. If you have visited anyone in the hospital, when you get home shower and change your clothes. This may seem extreme, but the germs can be carried on your clothes. If you suspect you have the flu, try to be seen within 2 to 3 days and get Tamiflu. It will reduce your symptoms and may prevent serious complications.






