Dear Concerned Students, I am <u>NOT</u> allowed in schools.

God

In the wake of the recent tragedy in Florida this image has flooded the internet. I see it in my Facebook feed almost daily. At first, it may seem like a good thing. But truth be told, I don't like it. Sure, that may make me sound unchristian, but it is the truth, I don't like the idea in this image. In fact, the more I see it the more I hate it. Hear me out before you go and get the stake and fire ready.

The question is fine. That "why" question goes back thousands of years. It was asked in the Old Testament by Job, it was asked by writers of the Psalms, and it has been asked in our own lifetime, where we witnessed two World Wars, the Holocaust, genocides in the Soviet Union and China, devastating famines in Africa, the killing fields of Cambodia, the emergence of AIDS, Columbine, 9/11, Bos-

ton Marathon bombing, the Florida night club shooting, most recently Stoneman Douglas High School, the list goes on and on. And so we find the question being asked: Why all of this if there's a loving and all-powerful God?

To be honest, I don't have the answer, at least fully. I know we live in a fallen world, a world where sin runs rampant. I know because of sin there is violence and tragedy, heartbreak and agony in this world. I know God wants us to love Him, freely and truly love Him. He does not want us to be mindless automatons devoted to Him because we are programed to. And that means we are free to reject Him, to live as if He didn't matter. When we do, we look to our own interests, our own wants and desires, all at the expense of everyone else. That selfish attitude leads to these kind of things happening and so much of the world's suffering results from the sinful action or inaction of ourselves and others.

No, the question is perfectly fine. It is the answer that bothers me. What kind of god does this answer give us? This god seems petty and childish. The attitude here is much like that of a child pouting and saying, "fine, if you don't like me I will take my ball and go home."

I can't stand in God's shoes and answer for Him, I don't have His mind, I don't see with His eyes. What I do know is that God does not let man dictate where or when or how or what He does. God is God, no one tells Him what to do or makes Him do anything. God is not a small, vindictive God who punishes people by removing Himself from a school and allowing them to be victims of a mass shooting just because public schools do not endorse Christianity or allow prayer in school. 2000 years ago men tried to tell God to stay out of their world by hanging Jesus on the cross and leaving Him there to die. It didn't work then and it doesn't work now. No, this is not how God would answer such a question. He is not small, petty, or vindictive. God did not leave the world 2000 years ago when He was told by sinful man to stay out, instead He continued to show His love for them, and He continues to show His love for us today.

We cannot answer for God. But we can trust Him. The question, "Why God?" is asked in scripture. It is never answered. We are told God's ways are not our ways, His thoughts are not our thoughts. Yet every

time that question, "Why God?" is asked, the person asking either points back to God's faithfulness or is pointed back to God's faithfulness. I don't know why, but I do know what God has done about it. He sent His Son to die on the cross, to show us His love as He died for us, in our place, so that we might be forgiven, so that we might be restored to a right relationship with Him. So in the midst of tragedy, when the question "Why God?" looms large, turn to God, trust God, look to the cross and the empty tomb. Remember His love for you.

If you are feeling very tired, upset and have a sudden severe pain in your chest that goes down your arm and into your jaw, you are very likely having a heart attack. You have about 10

seconds before losing consciousness. Of course if someone is with you have them call 911. But if you are alone start coughing repeatedly and vigorously. Take very deep breaths between coughs. The breaths get oxygen into your lungs and coughing squeezes the heart and keeps the blood circulating. The squeezing also helps the heart regain normal rhythm. Get help as soon as possible.


