Choices, something we make all the time and don't always think about. Recently my father shared with me some thoughts on making choices that I want to share with you. I hope you find these thoughts as useful and insightful as I did. ~ In Christ, Pastor Paul

There is a point along the Continental Divide high in the Rocky Mountains in Colorado at which the waters of a small stream separate. It would not seem to matter much whether a drop of water goes to the left or to the right. But the outcome of those drops of water is totally different. One drop goes to the west and eventually flows into the Colorado River and empties into the Gulf of California and the Pacific Ocean. Another drop goes east until it flows into the Mississippi River and dumps into the Gulf of Mexico and the Atlantic Ocean. Two drops of water, two entirely different destinations, but one small turning point that determines the outcome.

Many choices in life are like that. At the time, they don't seem significant. But those choices set in motion a series of events which shape your life and the lives of your children and grandchildren after you. The original choice wasn't a big deal, but the outcome was life-changing.

Sometimes people make unwise choices which aren't momentous in themselves, but they lead to tragedies: A teenager chooses to ride with a friend who has been drinking, resulting in a serious accident and the loss of life. A girl decides to have a drink at a party, resulting in her letting down her inhibitions. She ends up pregnant or with a venereal disease. Since seemingly small decisions can have such momentous consequences, how can we protect ourselves from making wrong choices?

A. MAKE CHOICES WHICH VALUE RELATIONSHIPS OVER RIGHTS. So much strife could be avoided in the family and in the church if we would put a premium on our relationships, set aside our rights, and let the Lord take care of us.

B. MAKE CHOICES WHICH VALUE GODLINESS OVER GREED. If we find ourselves thinking more about the things of this world and how to get them than about God; or if the thought of having them brings us more pleasure than our thoughts about God; or if we are willing to violate our conscience or neglect spiritual duties to pursue those things, then we are governed by greed. If our joy rides on our possessions or if we are filled with anxiety and grief if we lose them, then we are more governed by greed than by God.

C. MAKE CHOICES WHICH VALUE FELLOWSHIP WITH GOD OVER THE APPROVAL OF THE WORLD. As Christians, we always face a tension: If we pull out of the world too far, we lose our witness because there is no contact. But if we blend in with the world, we lose both our fellowship with God and our witness to the world. Jesus was the friend of sinners, but He was never tainted by their sin because He put a premium on fellowship with the Father and He never sought the approval of the world. We must put fellowship with God above the approval of the world in all our decisions.

D. MAKE CHOICES WHICH VALUE GOD'S ETERNAL PROMISES OVER IMMEDIATE PLEASURE. Jesus said, "Seek *first* the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things will be added to you" (<u>Matt. 6:33</u>, emphasis mine). Most of us want to seek the other things first and add the kingdom of God later in our spare time. As believers, we are to live by faith in the promises of God. When we face decisions, we take God into account and make

those decisions in line with His promises and principles, not the immediate gratification of the flesh. We deny ungodliness and worldly desires in light of the hope of Christ's return (<u>Titus 2:11-13</u>), trusting that His promises concerning eternity are true.

Someone has said that we tend to think of commitment to Christ like laying a \$1,000 bill on the table: "Here's my life, Lord. I'm giving it all." But the reality is that God sends most of us to the bank and has us cash in the \$1,000 for quarters. We go through life putting out 25 cents here and 50 cents there, in small deeds of faithfulness and obedience. But it's right there, in those little 25 cent choices, that our lives take their direction.

Make your choices based on God's principles: Relationships over rights; godliness over greed; fellowship with God over the world's approval; and, faith in God's promises over immediate pleasure from the world. Because if you have God and His promises, you have everything. So seek Him first, and all else is yours.

LET'S GET TO KNOW EUNICE KANG

Eunice Kang was born and raised in Warren, Michigan to a Catholic mother and Lutheran father. She and her three siblings were raised Catholic but she converted to Lutheran as a young adult. Eunice met her first husband, Russ in 1955, in a chemistry class at college. They

married in 1956 and had four sons who all became engineers. They went on several RV trips across the country and visited many national parks. They also went backpacking in the Smokey Mountains. When her youngest son started kindergarten, Eunice went back to school part-time and eventually got a BS in Math and Computer Science. She then worked for the gas company, and General Motors as a software engineer.

In 1977, her marriage to Russ ended in divorce. In 1980, Lockheed hired her and moved her to Sunnyvale, California. There she met Peter at his macramé concession in San Mateo. Peter had two daughters, 12 and 13 years old. In 1983, Peter was given a job opportunity in Los Angeles and had to act on it quickly. The girls stayed with Eunice while she looked for a new job. Northrop hired her and moved them to Southern California, where she married Peter. His girls are now a director at an HMO and a dentist.

After 12 years at Northrop, they gave employees incentives for early retirement. So, Eunice got a job at DreamWorks. It was exciting to be on a team to develop a totally new corporate database. Her manager left DreamWorks for Fox and later hired her to work at Fox. Eunice retired from Fox at 73.

Eunice's six children gave her nine grandchildren and one great granddaughter. They are spread throughout the land which has resulted in many happy trips for graduations, weddings, births, and reunions. A special family reunion was on a Disney Cruise. Two other special trips were an Alaskan Cruise with Peter and a Panama Canal Cruise with her sister Clara.

Peter was a talented man in photography, kendo, and painting. He taught kendo, a martial art, at UCI until his death of lung cancer in 2013. Their home is filled with his kendo trophies, photo art, and oil paintings.

Since her retirement in 2010, Eunice spends much of her time with family and with volunteer activities in her church and neighborhood. She especially loves to bake and sing. In her neighborhood she is on the HOA Board, Communications Committee, and Renovation Committee. She maintains the community directory and writes the community emails. At church she was on the Call Committee and is in the Choir, Outreach Committee, and Growing in Grace Bible Group.


