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Ever notice that negativity seems to overwhelm the world. It's the focus of much of what we see and hear on the news. One bad thing can ruin our day, our week, even our year. But does it have to? Consider the following story:

One day a professor arrived in a classroom and told his students there would be a surprise test. They all waited anxiously for the test to begin. He handed out the tests with the text facing down, then asked the students to all turn over the papers at the same time and begin.

To everyone's surprise, there were no questions on the paper, only a black dot. Upon seeing their faces, the professor said he wanted them to write about what they saw.

Everybody got started. At the end of the exam, the professor gathered all the papers in and started to read them aloud to the whole class.

All of them had explained the black dot and its position on the paper. After he had read them all, the professor explained he was not going to grade them, it was simply to give them something to think about: no one had written about the white part of the paper, everyone had focused on the black dot. The black dot was small in comparison to the piece of paper but everyone focused on the lone black mark.

The same can be said about life, he continued. The dark spots, the troubles and problems of life, are small compared to everything we have in our lives, but so often this is what we insist on focusing on. In life, we tend to overlook and take for granted many wonderful things that we have or happen around us and focus our attention and energy on failures and disappointments, troubles come they overshadow our knowledge that God is greater and more powerful than any black dot in our lives.

We tend to look at the dark spots and ignore the rest of life. We focus on the negative at the expense of the positive. Yes bad things happen, but life is more than moving from one "black dot" to the next. But when we focus on the black it consumes our life. The saying "your focus determines your reality" (Star Wars: Episode 1 – Qui-Gon Jinn) holds a profound truth. This is why St Paul writes to the Christians in Philippi, "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." (Phi 4:8).

Focus on the blessings God has given you, count them and you will soon be overwhelmed by just how blessed you are. Make the choice to focus on the good in life, as you do you will find the peace that only God can give you even in the midst of a bad situation.

An old Indian Christian was explaining to a missionary that the battle inside of him was like a black dog fighting a white dog. "Which dog wins?" asked the missionary. "The one I feed the most," replied the Indian. When we focus on God and the many blessings He has given upon us, we have peace and contentment. Our life is a gift given to us by God, with love and care, and we always have reasons to celebrate. Our friends, the job that provides our livelihood, the miracles we see every day all are cause for great joy but most of all we forgiveness and salvation in Jesus Christ and that is bigger than any problem we might have in this life.



HEALTHY IMMUNE SYSTEM

Although we should eat to boost our immune system all year long, during the cold and flu season. it is very important. We joke about chicken soup, but it helps flush out congestion and keeps us hydrated. Garlic is one of the most powerful antioxidants. A study , in 2014, showed that people that ate garlic everyday had less chance of catching cold.

If you usually eat a sweet, starchy breakfast, which can cause your blood sugar to rapidly rise, you become lethargic, hungry, etc. by mid-morning. Try hummus with a slice of bell pepper on your bread, bagel or muffin. Use fresh fruit on your cereal such a bananas Mix your milk with almond butter and warm it in the microwave. before pouring over cereal.

And, above all, exercise everyday. Remember just walking in your hallway is great especially if you have balance problems. Get 2 pound weighs and do as many reps as it takes to tire your muscles. Make a promise to your self that you will try these things for a few weeks. You will really see a positive difference.
