What are giving up for Lent? It's a very common question that we hear every year at about this. While it isn't a common practice of the Lutheran Church, most of us have heard of the practice of giving something up for the duration of the season of Lent. But I for one don't like it. The idea of giving something up for Lent has never sat well with me. I think it sets the wrong tone for the observation of the Lenten season.

All too often people have the idea that the reason you give up or to deprive yourself of something you like or that makes you happy for Lent is to make yourself feel bad, giving up certain types of luxuries as a form of penance. Since Lent has to do with Jesus suffering for our sins, people think it's a good time to try and make themselves suffer like Jesus. That is the WRONG reason to give up anything for lent! The only suffering that does us any good for is the suffering of Jesus for our salvation. HIS suffering accomplishes our salvation. HIS pain and anguish take place in order to win for us the forgiveness of sins. Our salvation and sanctification and holiness don't come because we somehow make ourselves suffer "with" Jesus. The forgiveness of sins is ours because Jesus suffers FOR US. In our place. As our Substitute.

Lent isn't about giving up something or feeling guilty or trying to take away something you like so that you can feel bad about the suffering our sins caused Jesus or somehow share in Jesus' suffering. Lent is all about meditating upon and learning more and more about what Jesus underwent FOR YOU. Lent is a time of prayer, praise, or a renewed focus. With that in mind, I would like to encourage you to consider a different option for Lent. Instead of giving up something try adding something. Now this is just anything that I want to encourage you to add, but this should be something to build and strengthen your relationship with God, something to help you focus on what Jesus has done for us through His passion and death on the cross.

So what can you add then? Perhaps add a time of prayer each day, or even start with just a short time each week. Read the Bible, study God's Word and spend time with it each week. There are also bible studies you could join. These are just some ideas, ways you can add more time for God in daily life.

As you add, whether it is one thing or several things, remember that the goal is that this practice helps you to focus on Christ, to grow in your relationship with Him. Let these things then continue beyond the Lenten season and become a part of your walk with God.

Above all, remember that this time is not about you, it is not about feeling guilty for what Jesus suffered for you, but rather it is a time to reflect upon His love for you. May you find His peace and comfort in this Lenten season as we look toward the cross and then beyond, to the empty tomb where Christ conquered sin, death, and the devil for us, because He loves us. Amen.

We also offer a "school aged" daycare for 1st through 5th grade students.
