"TIME TO STOP TRYING TO ANSWER THE 'WRONG QUESTIONS;" TIME TO START ASKING THE 'RIGHT QUESTIONS!""

At a Fall Pastors' conference ten years ago in New Jersey I heard a Southern Baptist pastor and author say that the North American church culture was on "life support." He went on to say that it was living off of the work, money, and energy of the previous generations, and the plug would get pulled when the money runs out. And, how long would that take? He suggested that would be when three-fourths of the people aged 55 and older pass away, because currently 80% of the donations supporting the church are given by those 55 and up. When I heard this ten years ago, needless to say, I was quite alarmed and dismissed the accuracy of his prediction, although I knew deep inside the mainline church was in trouble. A decade later in California I have come to believe that he was more accurate than I had realized!

Certainly the church of Jesus Christ will not collapse! The "Body of Christ" that was established by Jesus will survive until He returns! But, the church culture that I grew up in and most of us (at least those 35/40 years old and up) have come to know and feel comfortable in, is an endangered species. If it was on life support ten years ago, where is it today? Without going into all kinds of statistics which can be manipulated and massaged to support varying opinions, we can see that the church culture we have come to know is dying. Does Shepherd of the Valley look the same as it did 10 - 20 years ago? The church I grew up in on the other side of the country has seen their elementary school close and their Sunday attendance reduced by more than half since I left it about 30 years ago. And, I'm guessing most of us could share similar sad realities.

Faced with this kind of decline in recent decades, pastors and church leaders have asked how they can perform more effectively and 'do church better.' How do we grow as a church? How can we attract more people to come and join us? How do we develop church members and new church leaders to help bear the load of responsibility and keep this church going? And many a committee, task force or action team has wrestled to answer these questions. *But, it's time to stop trying to answer the 'wrong questions.' Rather, it's time to start asking the 'right questions,' and seeking to find solutions within our new culture and context!* In his book, *The Present Future*, that's what Pastor Reggie McNeal, the Southern Baptist preacher and author mentioned above, prescribes. I believe his diagnosis was right on, and so I also believe his prescription to be accurate as well. So, what are the RIGHT QUESTIONS? Briefly he states that the church must move from "churchianity" to "Christianity." How does the church become more "missional" and hit the streets and meet people where they are, as they are, and give them life in Christ? How do we develop followers of Jesus, rather than church members? How do we equip people to be missionaries and not members? Reggie challenges the way we have operated and thought, as a church. I would highly recommend getting his book, *The Present Future*, and read what he has to share for yourself.

I was reminded of this indictment of asking the 'wrong questions' in a movie I've seen several times now entitled, <u>MONEYBALL</u>. Even if you don't like baseball (what??) you'll enjoy this movie. While the story addresses the game of professional baseball, it's really more about cultural change. It reveals how hard it is to change a culture, and about how important it is to do just that, when the world around you has already changed! It has a powerful message, I believe, for the church and the creative ingenuity that is needed to defy tradition (not theology!) in order to ask the right questions and be the missional agent that Jesus has called it to be. In order to start asking the right questions and wrestling with answering them we will have to:

- 1. Think differently! We have to reframe and reform our questions, answers and ministry.
- 2. Challenge cherished practices and the sacred, "That's how we've always done it (and like it)"
- 3. Adapt or die! We will either embrace change and adapt, or stubbornly resist it and hold on as long as possible until we die.
- 4. Expect resistance as a sign of growth. Look for and celebrate renewal and signs of growth.

One of the keys in all of this will be to distinguish between truly "Adaptive Changes" and "Technical Adjustments." For example, effective preaching in our culture today requires interactive engagement. Adding power point or movie clips to a sermon are making technical adjustments. Reframing a sermon to welcome response and encourage involvement is initiating adaptive change. Certainly dealing with both technical problems and adaptive challenges are important. The church, however, must adapt and promote a vision of the future where God's people have a responsibility for understanding and sharing the faith simultaneously. To address both concerns, Shepherd of the Valley is taking the following two steps:

1. On May 18th from 8:30am to no later than 12 Noon we are calling on all staff, volunteers, committee and board members to gather for a semi-annual Collaborative Meeting. The goal is to more effectively coordinate and communicate with one another as we strive to pull together as a team. We will plan out the rest of the calendar year and share how we can integrate our serving more efficiently.

2. We are attending the Wheatridge sponsored workshop on May 15th, "Starting Smart." This is a first step in pulling together a new visionary task force seeking to ask the right questions and offer some answers and suggestions at the next congregational voters' meeting (August 2013). If you are interested in attending the workshop please call the church office for more details. It is hoped that the task force can bring "adaptive challenges" to the congregation for prayerful consideration and action.

I realize that if you have not seen the movie, <u>MONEYBALL</u>, or read the book, <u>The Present Future</u>, this article may be a little difficult to follow. Watch the movie on cable, or go to Netflix etc. Watch it and enjoy it . . . and learn from it. Pastor McNeal's book is readily available in hard copy or as an electronic download. Get it and read it! You will not be disappointed. And, please pray that we as a congregation and a part of the Christian church might proactively adapt and effectively share the timeless Gospel of Jesus Christ! "Un-Apologetic"

The Problem of Evil; Part 1

As I stated last month, the problem of evil is one of the chief objections the New Atheists raise against Christianity. As I began to write this column, it quickly became clear to me that doing this subject justice would require more than one column. So in this first installment, I will lay out the objection. Next month I will give a more in depth response to the problem itself, and why serious philosophers, even those with atheistic viewpoints, do not consider this a serious challenge to the Christian world view.

The standard objection of the problem of evil is as follows: How could a God that is all loving and all powerful allow evil to take place? Either he can stop evil, and chooses not to, in which case he is not good, or he is incapable of stopping evil, and is therefore not all powerful.

Before we get too far into this issue, I think we need to take note of one important issue. The problem of evil can be broken into two categories. There is the logical problem of evil (the atheists claim that there is a logical inconsistency in God's nature), and the emotional problem of evil (the fact that we see evil, and we don't like it). I would like to make clear that I will be dealing with the logical problem of evil in this column. If we try and use logical arguments to comfort someone suffering from the effects of evil, we are likely to come across as cold and un-sympathetic.

The first step in disarming the critic is to realize that the objection itself is fatally flawed from the outset. The atheist is admitting that evil exists by raising the objection. But where have they gotten this idea of evil from? There is an appeal to authority, an "ought" in the objection if you will. The unbeliever is making a claim about how God "ought" to act. But if the world is only material processes, molecules clashing in the universe as the atheists assert, there is no grounding for this notion of good or evil. Evil is not a thing in particular. It is a departure from an ultimate standard of good. As Christians, we have an answer for what grounds that ultimate standard of good. It is grounded in the nature of God.

Next month, I will continue to show how the atheist, by raising the problem of evil, gets stuck on the horns of his own dilemma. See you next month!



IMPORTANT MESSAGE for all Thrivent members

Three years ago Thrivent began a new program to encourage its members to designate a charity to receive "Choice

Dollars" from Thrivent. Members who have life insurance or financial products with Thrivent may receive a certain amount of Choice Dollars that they may allocate to their favorite charity. This costs Thrivent members nothing, other than the time it takes to make that designation. At the time the Choice Dollars program began, Thrivent gave members the option to do an automatic renewal of their Choice Dollars designation. **Thrivent has now stopped the automatic renewal**. This means that members will need to make that designation every year. Not doing so means your Choice Dollars will not be used. Furthermore, you can only do the designation after the date in the year in which your Choice Dollars are allocated to your account, which is dependent on several different factors. So to maximize your designation, you will need to check at the end of the year whether you have any remaining Choice Dollars that can be designated.

If you are a Thrivent member who has never designated your Choice Dollars before, or if you are a member who has designated your Choice Dollars to our church or school, we would encourage you to make that designation for this year. To do so, please do one of the following:

Go to www.Thrivent.com/thriventchoice Click on "Choice Dollars" and log in Under the "Search Organizations" enter "Shepherd of the Valley Church" or "Shepherd of the Valley School" and Moreno Valley for the city or another organization of your choice Click on Direct Now

2) To designate by phone:

Call 1-800-847-4836 At the prompt ask for Choice Dollars When you get a live person, tell him/her that you would like to designate your Choice Dollars to Shepherd of the Valley Church or School or other organization of your choice.

We recognize this takes more effort than in the past, but it is the only way you will be able to get your Choice Dollars to the organization of your choice.

Shepherd is working with other churches in Moreno Valley with this




