From the Pastor

"OUTREACH - EVANGELISM 1, 2, 3"

I think we make Outreach and Evangelism far more difficult and elusive than it truly is, or ought to be. When Jesus told His disciples to go and tell the ends of the world about Him, He did not send them alone, nor did He say develop some super effective or attractive program to draw people into the faith. He told THEM to go! He said He would go with them! And, He said to make new disciples by bap-

tizing and teaching them. hat model or formula is still the same today. He still sends His disciples out into the world. That's you and I, by the way. Granted, most of us cannot hop around the globe on mission trips to take the Gospel to the "ends of the earth." We can reach out in our own neighborhoods and communities. We can also help support the sending of others to far away places. Either way, the Lord still assures us that He will go with us and that the Holy Spirit will empower us and work in and through the Holy Scriptures. He still tells us to baptize and teach! Now, how complicated is that?

God's Outreach 1, 2, 3 Plan...

- 1. The Holy Spirit makes disciples! It is only by the power of the Holy Spirit working through the Word and the Sacraments that transforms and converts. God uses us as His instruments to share and teach others about Him, but He is the one who "calls and gathers" people into the church. Certainly we can, and ought to learn how to be the most effective instruments we can be. We need to continually grow in God's Word, that we may know and share it with others. We need to also use the gifts of understanding and intellect that the Lord has given us so that we can be effective tools.
- 2. As Christ's disciples, each of us is called to proclaim His Word and be (live out) His Word! Outreach and Evangelism isn't just the pastor's job, or primarily the responsibility of the church. Too many times we abdicate our calling and wait for the church or the pastor to come up with some slick and creative program to follow. Actually, Scripture teaches that all baptized Christians are to be witnesses "salt and light in the world." An old evangelism slogan sums it up well, "Each One Reach One!" The primary role of the pastor and the church is to teach and equip members to be winsome witnesses for Jesus in the world.
- 3. Church outreach programs and initiatives equip and mobilize disciples and provide an opportunity for members to team up with one another to reach out to the lost. Certainly there is much to be said for the followers and disciples of Jesus working together to reach out and make new disciples. As individual disciples invite others to know Christ, or as people are led to His church, there must be a plan for receiving guests and nurturing them in Word and Sacrament ministry. Likewise there must be some effort to train church members to be Christ's ambassadors. This is not advertising or church promotions. There is a place for that too, but this is honest to goodness outreach and evangelism to the unchurched, dechurched, and even anti-church!

It's been my experience that we get this simple plan all turned around. We look for glitzy programs that have supposedly worked well 'somewhere,' try to duplicate them in our own setting, and most often times forget all about the vital work of the Spirit. Well, enough! This time at Shepherd we are putting the Holy Spirit first as we pray weekly for our effectiveness in reaching out to the community. Then we are going to equip and train members in sharing their faith in a simple and natural way in their daily lives. [September 20th Workshop] From there we are going to put together an Outreach/Evangelism Action Team that will continue to provide more opportunities for training, and develop a support system for welcoming guests and assimilating members. Please keep our Outreach ministry in your daily prayers and plan to join us in September for our . . .

Apologetics in Evangelism 1

In keeping with our newfound focus on evangelism, I would like to use this month's article to explain the value of apologetics to the believer. In the coming months I will address the value of using apologetics while evangelizing to the unchurched, and address the two mindsets that are prevalent in our culture that create greatest obstacle to the Gospel message being received.

Starting with the believer may seem counterintuitive. After all, isn't the purpose of apologetics to defend the faith from outside attacks? As I will lay out below, apologetics has great value for the Christian, not only for use in defending the faith, but also for their own personal edification. Let's look at four ways that being a good Christian case maker can be of value to you as a Christian.

Apologetics will improve your knowledge of God.

Notice that in the great commission, the command is to make disciples of all nations. This is not a command to simply fill the Church with warm bodies, but to develop a robust Christian life. The first and greatest commandment given to us by Jesus is "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind" (Matt 22:37). Why does Jesus make a point to mention the mind? Because our spiritual lives ought to include a deeper understanding of the nature of God. We obviously get our knowledge about God's nature and character from the Bible. We have to remember however that many people dismiss the Bible out of hand. It is for these people that we must become good interpreters of God's word, God's nature and God's character. We may have to meet them where they are at, and explain things differently than we would in church. Rather than just telling someone "The Bible says it, so I believe it," we need to be able to unpack God's wisdom for them in a way that makes sense to an unbeliever.

Apologetics will aid your spiritual growth.

As Lee Strobel points out in his excellent book on evangelism "The Unexpected Adventure," there are two sentences you will never hear uttered together "My spiritual life is so dead right now" and "I am trying to win my neighbor for Christ." You will never pray more than when you realize your dependence on God to open the heart of your neighbor. You will never study apologetics more than when you are being challenged on the nature of God's character by a child or grand-child. You will never learn theology quicker than when you are forced to defend your beliefs against a heresy. In short, when you put yourself into the game, the urgency of spiritual growth becomes more acute. It's no longer an academic exercise. There's something on the line.

Apologetics will keep you grounded when you face your own doubts.

Everyone at some time or another will face doubts of their own. Having a strong foundation in apologetics can help you through times when you struggle emotionally with your faith. If our faith is grounded simply on feelings, then it can come as a severe blow when we face emotional trials. Have you ever been betrayed by your emotions? I have. I've had crises of faith where I was angry with God. The thing that brought me back from the edge on these occasions was that I intellectually knew God existed. Had I relied strictly on my emotions to tell me what was true, I would have cut bait and run. The grounding we get from a deep knowledge of God's wisdom and character can be a true blessing in times of turmoil.

Apologetics will help your evangelism.

How many of you like to take tests? If you are a parent, you have probably noticed a trend that happens with your kids over summer vacation. If you ask them a question about any subject they had in school the previous year, they probably can't pull the information right off the top of their heads. Why? Because they are enjoying their break, and haven't cracked a book in months. Now, if there was a test looming on the horizon about that same subject, you can bet that they would be able to communicate the information to you. Evangelism works in much this same way. If we don't do it, we get complacent and can't pull the information up when we need it. By continuing to study and learn, we are getting ready for the test. We are preparing to follow the command Peter gives us to "always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence".

On September 20th we will be holding an evangelism training class from 8 am until 12:30. I encourage all to attend. We will be equipping you to present the Gospel in a winsome and attractive manor. Please join us for this valuable training! We will see you there!

FIVE REASONS MANY CHURCHES ARE NOT GROWING

The Crux of the Matter The primary reason most churches are not growing, and a majority are declining, is because most pastors, staff, and church members are not evangelistic. Our theology may be sound. Our motives may be good. But we are not personally evangelistic or committed to reaching out to the lost. Indeed the culture has changed. Decades ago churches did not have to work as hard at reaching out because people came to the church. Not so today. Almost 2000 years ago, Jesus charged His followers to reach out to the ends of the earth. And for a very long time the church has answered that call by training, calling and supporting missionaries - usually sending them a long ways away. Today the mission field is at our door step (actually it always has been!) and we need to be the missionaries in our own neighborhoods and community. But too often we are reluctant to reach out, or think that that's a job for the professionals. So, we are not evangelistic, which in turn means that our churches are not outreach focused. Pastor and researcher, Thom Rainer, suggests five reasons why this is, and challenges the followers of Jesus to change.

- 1. We fail to be Biblically responsible for doing evangelism ourselves. Instead we think it's the responsibility of another person, program or church. We doubt God's Word and think that we can't share our faith.
- 2. We fail to put evangelistic opportunities on our calendars. While many of us perceive that to some degree we are evangelistic, we are not intentional about it. We do not set time aside each week to grow and learn how to be more effective. We don't plan intentional activities, perhaps as simple as meeting a co-worker or neighbor for lunch. Have you ever invited someone to come to church with you?
- 3. We fail to be consistent in our evangelistic efforts. What if we committed to doing just one outreach thing each week? Think about the impact we could have with fifty-two evangelistic encounters a year. Think about the impact a church would have if 100 members had 52 outreach minded encounters a year!
- 4. <u>We fail to pray for outreach and evangelism opportunities and efforts</u>. When is the last time you prayed for the Lord to give you an opportunity to share the Gospel? What if you did so every day? Imagine what would happen if we combined the power of prayer with intentional outreach evangelism.
- 5. We fail to do what is MOST important because we are so busy doing what is LESS important. Many of our pastors and church members may not be evangelistic because church activities keep them too busy to engage the community around them. Church life can keep us very busy, so busy that we neglect our families, and we neglect doing ministry outside the walls of the church.

This is not about pointing fingers or making excuses. We can be more evangelistic and outreach focused - individually and as a church. I know we can, in God's power! A church weak in evangelism and outreach is a church with members weak in evangelism and outreach. Conversely, a church that is strong in outreach and evangelism is a church with members who are strong in outreach and evangelism. Let us grow strong together in the Lord!


NEXT LUTHERAN CURSILLO WEEKENDS

October 16-19 for Men and October 23-26 for Women

Cursillo is an organization serving the Lutheran churches of Southern California to develop leaders in the Lutheran church through training and spiritual renewal.
