## **ALL ALONE**

Sola gratia (grace alone), sola fide (faith alone), sola scriptura (scripture alone). As Lutherans we likely have heard these before, if not the Latin then at least the English translations. But just what do they mean?

These three statements, along with the often forgotten solus Christus (Christ alone), are really what the reformation was all about. These statements represent the core of our faith, one that holds that we are saved by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone as He is revealed in Scripture alone.

Okay, but why is this so important for us? The answer may not be as simple as that statement, then again, it may be far simpler. Martin Luther sought to bring the church back to this basic principle that we are saved by grace through faith, not by works. The idea of indulgences and pilgrimages was to earn salvation by doing something to make up for our sins. Our good works needed to outweigh our sins. To help with this people could purchase these indulgences, they could visit certain sacred places or perform certain acts of devotion, they could view relics or give to the church, all in order to in some way make up for those sins they had committed or even those their loved ones had committed. But this all took away from the work of Christ. Still, such practices were encouraged by popes and councils as good and true, even if they contradicted the words of Scripture. This system then made for a salvation that was accomplished by the works of man and not God.

The reformation was all about returning to a salvation that was from God alone. And so these statements embodied that understanding. Our salvation is a gift of grace and of grace alone. Nothing we do could ever begin to atone for our sins. To even suggest that our works could was to undermine the work of Christ. Thus grace alone. We gain access to this gift of grace through faith, and this faith is given to us by the working of the Holy Spirit. Again, nothing we do earns this. Thus faith alone. We learn about this gift of grace and faith is worked in us as we hear the clear words of Scripture, and it is only Scripture that informs us about how we are to live as people who have received these wondrous gifts. And all of this is solus Christus, through Christ alone. It is the work of Christ alone that offers forgiveness, life, and salvation. Only through His blood shed on the cross are we saved. This great gospel message is made known to us through the pages of Holy Scripture, we lay hold of its benefits through faith, and we are given this gift by grace.

Sola gratia, sola fide, sola scriptura, solus Christus. Grace alone, faith alone, scripture alone, through Christ alone. And as all of this is given to us we find ourselves learning a fifth solae, soli deo gloria, glory to God alone. For our salvation, for the gift of forgiveness, for all that these bring us, we give glory to God alone because He alone is the one who has worked our salvation, it is His grace that gives to us all that we have and turns from us the wrath our sins deserve.

Remember this as we celebrate the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation. Yes, Martin Luther was important as it was through Him that God worked to bring the Church back to a scriptural understanding of His works, but even Luther would have not wanted this to be all about Luther, in fact he most likely would have been fine had his name been forgotten as long as the glory for our salvation was given to God alone.

## **HOW TO STOP DIABETES BEFORE IT STARTS**



Pre-diabetes is not a disease and it has no obvious symptoms. Your blood sugar may test high. Just not high enough to be type 2 diabetes. The biggest risk factors are a sedentary life style and obesity. Genetics also contributes to your risk. About one third of adults has pre-diabetes. Besides exercise, diet is very important:

- 1. Use a small plate instead of a dinner plate.
- 2. A quarter of your meal should be lean protein.
- 3. Half of your meal should be vegetables and fruit.

Most foods are not forbidden. Just eat them in moderation. (One scoop of ice cream instead of three.)

Eat your three meals a day plus two snacks so you do not become hungry and allow your blood sugar to be low. This will cause you to overeat, especially in the evening.




