PURPOSE OF THE CHURCH

I recently read an article online that asked a simple question: Can the modern church, in its present form, afford to spread the love of Christ even if it gets nothing in return? It's an interesting question. And really, the guestion behind this guestion is even simpler: What is the purpose of the church? Why are we here, what is our purpose? Is our purpose to fill the pews, to have a full house? Or is there something more to being church? I'm afraid that more often than we would care to admit, we judge an

event or ministry by how many people come. The idea being that the more people who come, the more chances we have of gaining new members, new bodies to fill the pews. Even worse, we see those bodies in the pew as being important because they then give to the church.

I can assure you, the church doesn't exist to see how many warm bodies can be gathered together on any given Sunday. Yes, it is nice to have people in the pews, yes we need to care for those in the pews, but they aren't the reason the church exists, they are there to be the Church. To be the Church they need to be fed spiritually, they need to be taught, to learn, to grow, and be equipped. Then, being the Church, they go out and they share the Gospel, they spread the love of Christ.

The local church then is a place for those who are the Church to receive the gifts of God and be discipled, so that they may be equipped to be the Church. Being the Church they take what they have received and give it to others. And what they receive as they gather together are those things that only God can give; grace, mercy, peace, forgiveness, love, and hope. The Church takes these into the world and share them with those they meet. They share the love of Christ with a world desperately in need of that love.

Do they get anything in return? Probably not. But that's not why the Church does what it does. The Church exists so that all may come to know the love of God that is in Christ Jesus. We spread that love, not to fill the pews, but so that others might be saved. If they come to our local gathering of Church, that's great, it's an added bonus. What matters is that they hear God's love for them, they learn that yes, they are sinners, but that Christ died for sinners, even them...even us.

So, can the modern church, in its present form, afford to spread the love of Christ even if it gets nothing in return? Perhaps the wording of this question is wrong, perhaps we should be asking is can the Church afford not to carry out the mission God has given her? The answer to that is a resounding no. We cannot afford to be anything other than what we are, sinners forgiven by God called to proclaim that same love to others.

Anger and Frustration and, Yet, HOPE

It seems as though the U.S. is out of control, things are getting worse each year, and we are sliding down a slippery slope. Both Clinton and Trump bring a lot of anger to the American voter. Some people can even see the possibility of civil war in the future.

As Christians we have the comfort that God is ALWAYS in control. Man may propose but God will dispose. God knows all about our political problems. Think about how Joseph felt when he ended up in Egypt and how God made good come out of bad. Think of Moses facing Pharaoh and how God decided how things would finally turn out. Think about David hiding from King Saul, or about Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego facing the orders of their king. Think about Paul in prison as he awaited trial from the Romans. These were men who firmly believed that God had the final say so. Always. And their hope was in the Lord.


I like two points that R. T. Kendall makes in the October Decision Magazine:
