What I am about to say is not meant to support or oppose any candidate or party, but it is meant to encourage Christian's participation according to Godly standards.


The first and most important point is that every Christian should participate. The worst thing that can happen is when Christians withdraw - "politics is dirty and crooked. I don't want to hear about it -- I don't have anything to do with it." Withdrawing leaves the field to those who work, give and vote for their own personal interests at the expense of others.

Second, beware of stories, reports and quotations generated by hatred, prejudice, or greed. Criticism and disagreement, and even condemnation, are often appropriate. False stories, half truths, and quotations out of context intended to destroy are another matter. I try to be very careful about believing or passing on stories and reports that support what or who I want to win. Verify, verify, verify what you send on. Be especially careful of quotations taken out of context. Try to understand the "other side."

Third, give as much attention as you can to the smaller, local contests. I have difficulty taking time for judges and propositions, but they affect people's lives a lot – so I will try.

Finally, Politics and government are part of the world that God loves, even if God and we do not like everything that goes on. The lives and future of people and of our community are at stake. GIVE IT YOUR BEST!!

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. Philippians 4:6

At the age of 57, the rock star known as Prince is dead.

According to the news reports, Prince was a genius, a prodigy, a phenomenon who won Grammy Awards, an Academy Award, and the respect of everyone in the music and fashion community. So far no one has made the claim that Prince was a great theologian, and that's a shame. Why? Here's the story. Prince gave his last concert in Atlanta on Thursday. After the concert and on his way home he was taken ill with the "flu." His private plane made an unscheduled landing in Illinois and, after being treated at the hospital, he continued home. On Saturday night he threw a party at his studios in Chanhassen, Minnesota. The party was a great success. Two hours in, Prince showed up and played a few tunes on his new purple piano. After his short performance, he fielded questions from the gathered crowd. One of his fans, quite understandably, asked about his health. Prince's reply was "Wait a few days before you waste any prayers."

You see, I told you he wasn't a theologian. And that's sad. It would have been far better if Prince knew what almost all of our Daily Devotioners know: that faith-driven prayers to the Triune God are never a wasted commodity. Repeatedly in Scripture the Lord encourages His people to call on Him, to come to Him, to rely on Him, to turn to Him, and trust Him. No, on Saturday night most of us would have disagreed with the rock icon and told Prince that prayers to the Lord are always a good thing. We would have said it, but many of us, in our own lives might not have practiced it.

You see, over the years I've noticed that many Christians have a self-imposed standard which divides our possible prayer requests into two different columns. The first column is composed of things for which we most definitely pray. In that list are things like prayers for the health of our children, prayers for suitable weather, or a new job, or for those whose faith is under attack.

Items in the second column are those things we have decided are too trivial, too inconsequential to be sent to the Lord for His attention. With his brief comment, Prince showed he thought he could take care of his health problems, without God's assistance.

My friends, I've looked through Scripture and have concluded that God doesn't have two columns in regard to prayer. I find no place where the Lord turned away from one of His people because He thought their requests were too trivial. No, because of the Savior's successful sacrifice, our Heavenly Father extends an open-ended invitation to call on Him. And we should. In big things and little things, in matters consequential and trivial, we should go to the Lord who stands ready to hear.

THE PRAYER: Dear Father in heaven, may I always be appreciative of Your invitation to hear my prayer, and may I always be ready to come to You with my praises and petitions. This I ask in my Savior's Name. Amen.

## Better Health Article of the Month: Health Doesn't Have to Take a Holiday

Planning a vacation during the summer months doesn't mean that you have to take a holiday from caring for your health. In fact, planning to see the USA in your Chevrolet (or your preferred brand of vehicle), can include opportunities to be physically active:

- Locate national parks along your driving route (or even slightly off of it) to spend 30 minutes, an hour, or even an afternoon walking or hiking. Sitting all day in a car can be detrimental to your health, so if you're going to get out and stretch anyway, enjoy a good walk.
- At rest stops, choose the parking spot the farthest away from the restroom. If you have kids, ask them to guess how many steps it would take to get to the main door and then have your kids start counting.
- Pack a football or Frisbee or even a travel-size Bocce ball set in your car trunk. Find some green space or city parks
  along your route to take a break from the driving and move your muscles.
- Once at your destination, don't plan the days so tightly that you can't take some time in the morning or evening to take a short walk or take a swim in the hotel pool.
- Research day trips in the area where you will be staying to do some hiking, biking, white-water rafting, kayaking, canoeing either rent or take along your own.
- For stays in a large city, plan to do some of your sight-seeing by foot. Check out books in the library about walking tours or find them on-line.
- Plan your trip around a fitness event or competition. Register your whole family to walk or run a 5K or other such event at a location you'd like to visit anyway.
- Plan a stay at one of our many Lutheran camps (www.nloma.org). With most of the camps, you have built-in activities such as swimming, hiking, canoeing, rock-climbing, or biking.

Make sure the activities you choose are age-appropriate for your kids. More importantly, find an activity that will be enjoyed by all members of the family. Your family will make lasting memories, and everyone's health will benefit from the experience.

## **KEEPING YOUR KITCHEN SAFE**

- 1. Do not rinse meat, fish or poultry before cooking. You can spread bacteria to your sink, counters and other surfaces.
- 2. Be sure to let food cool a few minutes before removing it from the microwave. This prevents getting scalded when removing covers. Let containers cool before handling.
- 3. Your refrigerator should be kept at 40 degrees and freezers at 0. If you set them any higher bacteria can grow.
- 4. Cleaning produce with a brush under running water has been found to be more effective than using a commercial wash.


