"IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME."

In 1989 the film "Field of Dreams" was released. The movie centered around a novice farmer, Ray Kinsella, who heard a voice while in his corn field tell him, "if you build it, he will come." Ray later sees a baseball diamond in his field, which he then proceeds to build. Eventually baseball greats from the past appear on the diamond, coming out of the corn field. One of these players turns out to be Ray's father.

Ultimately this gives him the chance to reconcile with his father on that baseball diamond.

The movie is a great movie, one I enjoyed watching. At some point the phrase, "if you build it, he will come," became "if you build it, they will come." But what does any of this have to do with church or faith? The church newsletter isn't a movie review paper after all.

"If you build, they will come." This idea has found its way into our society. It has come to portray a mindset that if you build or supply what people want, they will come to you. This "field of dreams" mentality has even found root in the church. If we have the right program, if we have a good youth leader, if we have the right music. If we have the right whatever it is, that will attract people, people will come for that and then our pews will be full, then we can reach people.

Now, there is nothing wrong with having good leaders and exciting programs that present the Gospel. There is nothing wrong with having music that appeals to different people as long as that music points to Christ crucified and not the individual. But this mentality about these things being what brings members to a church is all wrong. God did not say that it would be our programs or music or even our leaders that would cause people to give glory to Him. He did not say "Have exciting programs and good music and make disciples..." No, He said, "Go." He said it was our works that people will see and so give glory to Him.

Jesus tells His disciples, and us, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

We are called as His disciple to go, to reach out to the world. This is why Jesus called His disciples 'fishers' of men. Fishing requires action on our part, going to where the fish are, not waiting for the fish to come to you. We have to go out and bring the message of the Gospel to people. That is how we bring people to God, by our actions, through the living out of our faith.

Most people though, when they hear the command to "go" and make disciples, immediately think of missionary work. They have this idea that going involves some extensive travel to distant places or foreign lands. But this word "go" that we find in the Great Commission means more. It is not simply a going to far away places but is more encompassing. Literally we could read this passage to say, "as you are going about," that is, as you are living your life, doing the things you do every day, there you are to make disciples. It is not just a going to foreign lands but a going out into your every-day life, your work, your family, your community.

Yes, who our leaders are is important. Yes, music and program can help to teach people. But we cannot rely on these to bring people to Christ. Instead we live out our faith, we let our lights shine, and we share the Gospel with the world. We go out into the world and proclaim God's love. We go out into our community, living our faith, so that as we go we can share God's love with all people.

"If you live it, they will see." This is the mentality we should have. We should not rely on having the right programs or leaders, but on our living out our faith. Having good programs and leaders can help teach them or help encourage them, but it is us, living out our faith and sharing the love that has been shown us that will bring them in to see those programs and hear those leaders. We are still called to be "fishers of men," to go out where the people are and there, as we are going about, to share the Gospel, to make disciples.

How to Pack Your Shoebox

HEALTHY BRAIN HABITS

The frontal lobe of our brain is the most vulnerable to the effects of aging and degeneration. All studies have shown that individuals who play puzzles, board games etc. were less likely to have " senior moments."



As the brain ages the white matter often develops small lesions which can disrupt blood flow. An extensive study through the University of British

Columbia has shown that women between the ages of 65 to 75 that did strength training three times a week could stop the progression of these lesions. You do not need to go to a gym or buy weights. Use soup cans. Do bicep curls, triceps extensions, calf raises, and mini squats. And WALK!!
