"CHURCH MEMBERSHIP" WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A CHURCH MEMBER?

There are a number of ways to answer this question, depending on your perspective. **From a church organiza-tional-records perspective** it means that one has joined the church, say Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church in one or more of the following ways:

- 1. Those children who have been baptized at Shepherd of the Valley are considered to be members of the Holy Christian Church and baptized members of Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church.
- 2. Those who have completed the Communion Instruction Class are considered as baptized and "communicant" members of Shepherd of the Valley.
- Those who continue on to complete the program of Confirmation Instruction and present a public profession of faith before the congregation are considered as full baptized and communicant Adult members of Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church.
- 4. Members who join Shepherd of the Valley and transfer their membership from another Lutheran Church (LCMS) are also received as Adult, baptized and communicant members of the church.
- 5. Those who come to Shepherd of the Valley from other Lutheran Church bodies (ie. ELCA) may become members either by taking a brief course of instruction that teaches what we as LCMS Lutherans believe and make an Affirmation of Faith before the congregation. Or, in some cases, they may not need the brief course, but join by only making an Affirmation of Faith.
- 6. For those who have no Lutheran background, perhaps no previous church membership at all, or may not be baptized into the Christian faith, they would take a course in the Christian faith and the Lutheran church, be baptized and present a public confession of faith before the congregation, and be confirmed as an Adult.

Note: If you have been worshiping with Shepherd of the Valley for a while, perhaps even years, and are not sure if you have been officially received into church membership, please contact Pastor Krueger. We are not trying to be difficult or put an undue burden on anyone, but are striving to handle the matters of God's church decently and put things in good order. Pastor Krueger may also be contacting some of our people to address and complete 'official membership' procedures. (FYI... Not all churches follow these procedures for official church membership. For some, whomever is there on any given Sunday morning - that's their membership).

Perhaps more importantly, however, this question may be viewed and answered from a *spiritual-discipleship per-spective* as follows:

- 1. Those who have been baptized into Christ are now a part of the communion of saints, the Holy Christian church, one spiritual body whose one and only Head is Jesus Christ! Church membership from this perspective is based on **FAITH!** This faith comes to infants and little children via the Holy Spirit in the waters of Baptism. For those who are older and can reason and understand, this faith comes by the Holy Spirit working in and through the inspired Word of God as it is read and taught. That is why the: profession...affirmation...confession... of faith is included above, as a vital part of church membership.
- 2. Closely related to number one, just stated, are the good works and spiritual sacrifices offered to God as a fruit of faith (1 Peter 2:5) As Paul declares in his letters to the Corinthians, Ephesians and Romans, God has gifted His church (body) with many different gifts that are to be used to serve others and worship Him! Church membership is not just about "joining" a certain church or denomination. It is not just about "understanding" the doctrines and confessions of a certain church organization. It is actively living that faith and producing the good works of faith that identify one as a church member. Church membership is a verb of "action" as much as "being!"
- 3. Furthermore, church membership insists on reaching out and inviting others to be a member of the church too, so that they may enjoy the blessings of the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation in Jesus Christ! Jesus commands His church members to "Go! Teach and baptize!" (Matt. 28:19)

While we always want to conduct the matters of God's church decently and maintain good order, let us truly be the "servant-church members" He has gifted and called us to be! By His Spirit may we function as the members of His Body, the church, edifying and building one another up in a spirit of unity and peace, loving as He has loved us and serving as He showed us! Let us joyfully confess together, "I believe in the Holy Christian Church and the communion of Saints!" To God be the glory! Amen!

DIPLOMACY, NOT D-DAY!

Last month I left you all hanging out on my doorstep waiting for advice on how to engage and evangelize to different groups that come to your door. Before we get into the theology of different groups you might have interactions with, I would like to go over some basic guidelines and tips that will help make these conversations less intimidating, and hopefully more fruitful.

First and foremost, be nice. I know that should go without saying, but I would like to stress it again anyway. BE NICE! The apologetic ministry Stand to Reason's motto is "We want our encounters to look more like diplomacy than D-day." Always remember that we are ambassadors for Christ. How we act and behave reflects on our sovereign. Part of good case making is having an attractive manner. Think of it this way, when was the last time you changed your position on a particular issue because someone screamed at you and called you names? Being nice doesn't make your point correct, but people will be more inclined to consider your position if presented in a courteous way.

Don't take lightly the fact that the people on your doorstep are prepared to have a conversation about religion. They have a game plan, and know where they want to lead you in the conversation. Even if preparing for encounters such as this is something you enjoy and put effort into, it's easy to be caught off guard and a little flatfooted with the sudden appearance of people on your front porch. I recommend asking the people if you can make an appointment and have them return at a later date. Most are more than willing to accommodate your request. This will give you time to mentally and spiritually prepare for the encounter. Use the time wisely. Do some research on the group whose members you will be talking to. Think ahead of time of questions to ask and write them down. Pray. I don't say that flippantly. Pray for protection, wisdom and guidance as you engage in these conversations.

Ask good questions. I will focus on specific question to ask each group as we progress through this topic, but some good general questions are:

- "Why should I believe that your organization (The Mormon Church, The Watchtower Society) actually speaks for God"? Both of these groups believe that salvation does not exist if you do not belong to their organization (no, not even for Lutherans!). They can't both be right about that. It's fair to ask them why they believe you must be a member of their group, rather than believe that Jesus has covered all who put their trust in Him.
- "If I were to join your group, then die tomorrow, would I be saved?" Most will not want to give you a direct "yes" or "no" answer to this. That is because there are works involved in the salvation formula on their view. Christ's sacrifice only opens the door to being saved, but it is not sufficient to save. You have to earn your way in. I don't know about you, but that doesn't sound like very good news to me. That might be worth pointing out to your new friends.
- Then the mother lode of all questions: "Who was Jesus?" Our understanding of who Jesus was is critical to our understanding of how salvation works. You will find that while certain groups use familiar language about Jesus, they mean something entirely different than the classical Christian definitions of the same words. Ask them to be more specific about what they believe about Jesus and his divinity and humanity. If something doesn't sound right to you, ask more questions until you are comfortable you understand their view. This will help you to identify problems with the view that can be addressed later in the conversation.

Alright, we have laid some groundwork for you to get your feet wet in conversations. Next month I will begin to explain some of the Mormon beliefs, and how they differ from our own. Following that I will offer a game plan for discussions with Mormon missionaries that might appear on your doorstep. Until then, just keep the conversations going!




COMING TO SHEPHERD!






Joseph Project - Community (Citywide) food
