"God Bless ... AND RENEW ... America!"

It seems one can hardly watch the television anymore without being bombarded by profanity, sexually explicit content, or barely clothed women prancing around – and that's just the commercials! Is it any wonder why sexual morality in our culture has gone so far astray? When I was growing up, I wouldn't have imagined the filth that is shown regularly on broadcast television today. My grandmother, who was born before televisions were around, told me that it was scandalous to advertise feminine hygienic products on television! My, how times have changed! What would she say now? And not just in the media.

How about schools? When I grew up, my school day started with the pledge of allegiance to our flag. Prayer was still allowed in schools back then (or a time of silence later on), and my high school graduation opened with a prayer led by the local clergy. We didn't have condom machines in the restrooms, and immoral behavior was the exception, rather than the norm. I'm not saying that we were angels, mind you, but we knew right from wrong - and usually did what was right, even if it was out of fear and respect. Today, saying the pledge of allegiance is disapproved of in many areas. Elementary school children are forced to watch plays that portray homosexuality as a perfectly normal and acceptable lifestyle choice. Children are taught that parents who object to homosexuality or its indoctrination in our schools are divisive, intolerant, narrow-minded, bigoted,...you get the idea. And now the Boy Scouts of America are considering changing their membership policy so as to not discriminate against homosexuality. Does anyone else feel discriminated against as a heterosexual? How have we gone astray? Can anything be done to reverse this trend?

How did our nation end up at this point of moral decay? The answer, quite simply, is slowly and steadily. In the book, <u>*The Frog in the Kettle*</u>, by George Barna, he explains that if you want to cook a frog you don't throw him into a boiling kettle of water. Instead, you let him swim in some lukewarm water and gradually turn up the heat until it boils, and he cooks. He doesn't even know he is in trouble until it's too late. America is in "hot water" due to a long and steady increase in heat! The moral decline in America did not happen overnight. If it had, there would have been a huge outcry. It simply would not have happened. Our culture would have rejected the change. But it didn't happen overnight. It has taken decades, of which most of us are witnesses! Each moral concession made was barely noticed with the passage of time, at least by the majority. That is how we've ended up here. But we can do something about it. And we must! Now!

Are you registered to vote? If not, you should register right away. It is important for Christians to be informed of the issues and candidates, and to make your voices heard. We can make changes by making our voices heard at the polls. This is true for national elections right down to school district issues. Christians are behind the curve on advocacy issues. Other groups aren't. Unfortunately, there's a double standard in this country. Homosexual and Pro-Choice advocacy groups, for example, are accepted readily into the mainstream, and their advocacy groups are even respected. When the Moral Majority or the Christian Coalition are mentioned in the media, they are often lumped into the pejorative "Christian Right", which is practically spat out of the mouths of media pundits and labeled as intolerant and judgmental. We have a voice, and we have the right – and duty – to make our voices heard.

Much more importantly we have to live our own lives in Christ morally and be the flesh and blood testimonies of our Lord to others around us. We need to take up our crosses and follow Him. We need to share how Jesus took up His cross for all and has redeemed mankind from sin, death and eternal condemnation. So, when we fall short of living as He wills, we can repent of our sins and be forgiven. It is only by God's grace that we are saved! And, "in view of God's mercy, we are to offer our bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God... We are not to conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of our minds." (Romans 12:1-2)

Yes, our nation is in a moral decline. This decline is still progressing. It is up to us as committed and concerned Christians to take an active role in changing this direction and taking a firm stand on our faith and beliefs! God has called on us to contend for the faith. That is not only in the political arena but in every nook and cranny of daily life! Let us pray for God's renewing and transforming blessing on culture and nation. May God use us to be the salt of the earth and lights in the world, that those in darkness might see our faith and good works, be drawn to the light of faith, and praise our Father in heaven!

The Problem of Evil; Part 2

In my last column, I laid out the problem of evil and began a response to those that would challenge the existence of God based on the problem. Let's now conclude our thoughts on the problem of evil.

British philosopher and atheist Bertrand Russell once commented, "No one can believe in a good God if they've sat at the bedside of a dying child." This rejoinder had very strong rhetorical power, and the challenge was used successfully for years until the Christian philosopher William Lane Craig asked the obvious question. What is the atheist Bertrand Russell going to say to the dying child? What does his world view allow him? Sorry kid, tuff luck? That's the way it goes? In the grand scheme of things, your suffering is pointless? It seems that while the Christian world view offers comfort, hope of healing in this life, and surety of healing in the next, the nonbeliever has no words of comfort to offer anyone. And let's face it; it's not just dying children that must face this problem. It's a surety for all who walk the earth that one day we will perish.

Part of the problem is the atheist's expectation that God's sole purpose is to provide for and keep safe his human "pets." We are not God's pets! This view assumes that God's purpose for this earth is to make us all happy and pain free. Under this view, God would fail the test to be sure. But I think the more accurate understanding of God's purpose for this world is to work things so the most people possible will come to a saving faith in Christ. The burden here is for the challenger to show that God could have made a world with less pain, suffering and evil that would have allowed more people to come to that saving faith. They are not going to be able to o that, and as I said in a previous column, this is why most serious philosophers, even atheist ones, no longer consider the logical problem of evil to be a strike against Christianity.

This leads me into my next point, that the problem of evil doesn't take into account God's justice and mercy. When the non-believer complains about the problem of evil, she is not taking into account the full nature of God. God's justice does not take place solely in this world alone. There is punishment for evil in the next life. The atheist is simply not in a position to determine that evil is going unpunished, or that evil deeds were not covered by Christ's atonement on the cross. You see, the Christian world view not only explains why there is evil (the free will of men), but offers a solution to the problem (justice for those that deserve it, mercy for those who will accept it).

Now, they may complain that God should stop evil before it happens, and God does do this according to His will at times of His choosing. But we must keep in mind that God works all things for His divine purpose. Only God is in a position to know the final outcome of all events. The burden is therefore on the atheist to show that no possible good can come from the evil actions God allows. That is a heavy burden, and one she cannot possibly prove.

In conclusion, evil is everyone's problem, not just Christians. All world views must account for it, offer good reasons why it exists, and propose a solution to the problem. Once we acknowledge that the problem actually exists (as the atheist does by raising the challenge), we must look at which world view has the most explanatory power in dealing with the problem. I think we have shown without a doubt that the Christian world view holds up to the challenge well,




BOUTIQUE NEWS

The Meyer Minute from May 15, 2013

"Come unto Me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." (Matt.11:28)

So when you're tired, too much to do and not enough time to do it, and worst of all, you're feeling guilty because you can't get it all done, that's the way you were raised, then lift the burden off your heart by hearing, "Come unto Me."

When you're sad for whatever reason, in grief, in dejection, feeling sorry for yourself, and when you're convinced nobody cares, maybe no one does but Jesus does. When He calls God's children to Himself, He puts His hand on you, on you, and blesses you. "Come unto Me."

When you're fearful, anxious, worried... Why are people so uncaring? Why do they wave off my anxiety by saying, "It's wrong to worry"? When you can't simply be happy, the One who is the same, yesterday, today and forever sees the outcome of the problem that worries you. He'll work it for your good. "Come unto Me."

When things are going well, so well that you don't feel a pressing need to hide yourself in the Rock of Ages, when joy and bliss, when contentment and satisfaction, a sense of being accepted and loved are yours... then remember Who gave this pleasant season to you and heed this truth, "prone to wander, Lord I feel it; prone to leave the God I love." "Come unto Me."

"Come unto Me, ye weary, and I will give you rest." O blessed voice of Jesus, which comes to hearts oppressed! It tells of benediction, of pardon, grace, and peace, Of joy that hath no ending, of love that cannot cease."
