OUR HELP IN THE YEAR PAST! OUR HOPE IN THE YEAR TO COME!

The beloved hymn of Isaac Watts, "O God, Our Help in Ages Past," offers a jumping off point as we remember the blessings of God to Shepherd of the Valley in this past year, and the hope that we trust in, in the next year. This past year, 2012-2013 has truly been a blessed one. A year ago we moved into a new parish year somewhat apprehensively with a budget gap (deficit), expecting that we might have to spend more than we projected receiving. We held the line on most budget line-items and agreed that we would meet half way through year to see how things were going and make cuts if needed. And, an appeal was extended to the membership to do just a little more and give a little more to balance out the budget. Well, here we are a year later, praising and thanking God! He has blessed us through the faithful stewards and members of Shepherd of the Valley. We not only made the budget, but we surpassed it. We spent less than was projected and received more than hoped for - "our cups runneth over!" Thank you to all! Praise and thanks be to our God, our help in the year past!

There is much more to celebrate! This past year we have seen the average Sunday morning worship attendance increase about two percent. While 2% may not sound like much of an increase, it is a great step in the right direction. For the past 15 years or so we have seen a slow and steady decline in our attendance and membership. We have had a significant number of people move out of the area, but many have either just stopped attending church or chosen to go elsewhere. This past year God has blessed us with an increase in attendance and a number of new members, some very involved and dedicated. Praise the Lord! Of course, we have also commended into the Lord's eternal arms a few of our beloved and long time saints, as they entered into glory.

Our preschool also had a very good year. Since the down turn in the economy in 2008, it has been very difficult for our school to remain viable. Thanks to the diligent and frugal management of the school, and some financial assistance from the church, it has weathered the storm when many other preschools in Moreno Valley had to close. This past year, though, the school has operated at near capacity and exceeded its budget as well. As we began the 2013-2014 school year were almost completely full and have a growing list of students waiting for an opening. During the difficult years, the Lord blessed Shepherd of the Valley with the Big Springs School that leased four classrooms and an office from us. Now that our program is rebounding and theirs is growing as well, there have been discussions about Big Springs moving part of their school operation to Temecula and our school reclaiming more classroom space. We had even considered trying to somehow share the Youth Room with a two-year old classroom, but the church boards and the voters' assembly did not see that as a good move for either program. Further discussions will continue as we try to address the growing needs of the school. What a wonderful problem (blessing!) to have. Praise the Lord once again! God works in mysterious and wonderful ways, doesn't He? When Big Springs came along, we needed them and they needed us. They have a fine educational program that reaches out to students with very specialized and extreme needs. What a blessing to be able to offer them a place and space for their much needed service to our community. We trust the Lord to show us His direction for the future.

There's more! Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church has had a growing presence and contribution in our Moreno Valley community. We are very involved with the food pantries and the faith based collaborative of churches. We've had the opportunity to host a couple of special forums with our chief of police and school district superintendent. And, we serve as the "home base" for the Moreno Valley Master Chorale who annually presents several concerts for the community at Shepherd. Northridge Elementary school has always been a special neighbor to our school and church, so along with many of the churches in our city who have adopted schools, we have adopted them as our school. We need to explore ways to help and assist the students and staff of Northridge. And, as mentioned, Shepherd has taken an active role in the leadership work in our community assistance programs of: CAP and the Joseph Project. It is very important that our church be in the community and engage and serve people where they are. One of the best compliments a church can receive is when the community genuinely feels that they are "glad that the church (Shepherd) is here!"

There is a huge challenge before us, as you know. One out of five people in America profess a faith in Jesus Christ and are regularly and actively involved in worshiping and serving Him in and through a church. While four out of five people in America 'claim' to be Christian, it's obvious that most of them only "talk the talk," but do not "walk the talk." The fastest growing religious groups in America are: Islam (Muslims); Mormons; and the "Nones" (those who check the religious affiliation box - "None"). Did you notice? Not the Christian church. (although some consider Mormonism part of Christianity). The challenge is great, but so is the power and Spirit of our Lord and His Word. The fields are white and ripe for harvest. Did you know that there are more Christians in Africa than in all of the Americas combined. There are more than twice as many Lutherans in Africa than in North America. The mission field is at our door step, in our neighborhoods and in our community. Pray for workers to go out into the harvest field. Pray that the Lord motivate and send YOU.

Shepherd needs someone to work with the pastor to coordinate our community participation with food and clothing distribution organizations, to manage our own benevolent/assistance ministry, and to oversee our holiday food basket assistance. This coordinator would work with the pastor, the Board of Lay Ministry and our Office Manager and Treasurer, Marge Clark.

STEWARDSHIP TEAM (Task Force) LEADER Every church needs strong stewardship leadership! This position is not about fund development and raising the resources

needed to meet the budget. Shepherd of the Valley needs a mature "disciple-leader" to put together and head up a task force to promote, equip and educate the congregation in Biblically sound Godly stewardship. This man or woman will work closely with the pastor and the Mission and Ministry Board of Directors.

EVANGELISM TEAM (Task Force) LEADER If you are even reading this ministry-service position description, you just might be the one that the Lord is urging to serve Him and His church in this area. Most people tend to ignore or avoid anything with the word "evangelism" attached to it. We desperately need someone who has a passion to reach out to lost people with the Gospel, to motivate and facilitate the teaching and deploying of witnesses to share the love of Christ. Said leader and team would work closely with the Board of Lay Ministry and the pastor.

ELEMENTARY YOUTH "AWANA" LEADER If you're seeking an exciting and rewarding ministry opportunity . . . LOOK NO FURTHER! The Youth Action Team of Shepherd is seeking an individual or couple who enjoys young children and their growth in the knowledge of the Bible, and their relationship with Jesus. This leader would administer the Awana program of our Elementary Youth Ministry, lead the Awana teachers and assist with the weekly meetings conducting openings and helping maintain discipline. Training in the Awana program would be arranged as such opportunities arise in our area. This person would work with our Youth Ministry Director, Drew Covert and the Youth Action Team.

TLC-SMALL GROUP MINISTRY COORDINATOR A few years ago we used to have monthly meetings of our Small Group Leaders for coordination and skills development. While our TLC-Small Groups continue to function independently it would be very helpful to have the leaders gather monthly-or-quarterly to share and pray. CHILDREN'S CHURCH & CHILDREN'S SERMON COORDINATOR

While it may not seem like a very vital function, Shepherd truly needs someone to coordinate and schedule people to volunteer at leading Children's sermons in both services and covering Kid's Church during the 10:45 am service. It mostly requires lining up people to serve, and working with the pastor to provide children's lessons and videos. This person would work with the pastor and Marge Clark.

SHEPHERD OF THE VALLEY WEB-MASTER While this sounds like some kind of position out of "Dungeons and Dragons" it is a very, VERY, important position that Shepherd of the Valley has needed to fill for some time. Most people learn more about Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church and School on the internet than any other place. Newspapers and the Yellow Pages are soon to be a thing of the past (if not already). We need someone who has some computer savvy to learn and be able to monitor and edit our SVLC web-homepage. This is IMPORTANT. This is where Shepherd most often gives its 'first impression.' There have been times when the same newsletter or pastor's page has remained on the web site for almost a year! This should not be a long term commitment and can hopefully conclude its work by early 2014. This Task Force will work under the leadership of Pastor Krueger. A final report will be presented to the congregation for their adoption. Only dreamers who firmly believe that all things are possible through God need apply!
